Appendix A to these Rules and Regulations stipulates the transitory arrangement for rules and regulations that underwent a substantial change when compared with Rules and Regulations from previous Academic Years.

For PTMSc 20 the following rules apply;

16.1 *Allotted time for study*

For the Part time MSc in Management program the nominal duration is 2 years and 3 months.

A request for an extension of the nominal study time can be submitted to Program Management. A maximum of six periods of 6 months may be granted; the allotted study time for the Master's is 5 years. In such cases the student is required to pay an additional tuition fee.

The details of the fee can be found on the Program Portal/Learning Management System. Successful completion of the program must occur during the allotted time.

For PTMSc 22 the following rules apply;

Article 16.4 is replaced by article 16.4 of the Rules and Regulations of Part-time MSc in Management program 2017-2018

16.4 *Admission (Pre) Master's Program*

Obtaining satisfactory results in the MSc Pre-Master's courses as determined by the Program Director during the admission process is a pre-requisite for entering the MSc Master's Program. Students failing two or more courses of the MSc Pre-Master's Program will not be admitted in the MSc Master's Program.

If successful completion of the MSc Pre-Master's Program cannot be achieved due to extenuating circumstances, the student is allowed to participate in the MSc Master's Program pending the result of these circumstances, unless the Exam Committee General Management decides otherwise.

Should a student not have submitted certified copies of diplomas and transcripts of a bona fide Bachelor or Master degree before the start of

the MSc Master's Program, the student will not be granted permission to enter the MSc Master's Program.

For PTMSc 23 the following rules apply;

16.4 Admittance on the basis of obligatory (Pre-Master) courses

- d) A student can start the Master phase with a maximum of 3 ECTS from the categories b and c mentioned above that still have to be completed successfully. If at the start of the Master phase it is not yet known how many ECTS are still missing, the student can start with the Master phase at his/her own risk. In extenuating circumstances the program director has the mandate to conditionally accept a student in the Master's with a maximum of 6 ECTS from the Pre-Master's program, not being Foundations of Research, Analytical Business Tools, Business Statistics).

Because the retakes of the courses Managerial Economics and Marketing Strategy take place in September a student who needs to make a retake or overall in these courses can start the Master's phase with a maximum of 9 ECTS of the categories b and c at his/her own risk. When, after all grades have been established, it becomes clear that there are more than 3 ECTS that have not been fulfilled, the student has to stop with the program.
